
Age of Child	Preferable Limit	Acceptable Limit	Harmful Limit
Under I Year	Two days	Seven days	More than seven days
I-2 years	Three days	Ten days	More than ten days
3-5 years	One week	Three weeks	More than three weeks
6-9 years	Two weeks	Four weeks	More than four weeks
10-13 years	Four weeks	Six weeks	More than six weeks
14+ years	Six weeks	Nine weeks	More than nine weeks




ACE Score Increases Suicide Attempt








Abuse by Education













Household Dysfunction







Abuse by Age (Birth Year)




Neglect by Sector




Neglect by Age (Birth Year)



Household Dysfunction by sector, part I







Household Dysfunction by sector, part 2 Incarceration Substance Abuse
