## DMV Updates in Response to COVID-19 - May 2020

<u>Local</u> DMVs have adjusted their services to avoid crowds at their various locations during the COVID-19 emergency.

## Virginia DMV

- Driver's licenses and identification cards expiring on or before June 10, 2020 are extended for 90 days, not to exceed July 31, 2020.
- Customer service centers are closed until May 11.
- Vehicle registrations that expired in March and April are extended for 90 days, and those expiring in May are extended for 60 days.

## **District of Columbia DMV**

- All driver licenses, vehicle registrations, and vehicle inspections expiring after March 1 through the end of the public health emergency are extended without penalty until June 29.
- All DC DMV in-person Service Centers are unavailable to the public.

## Maryland MVA

- Driver's and business licenses, identification cards, permits and registrations that expire or are eligible for renewal during the state of emergency have been extended until the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the state of emergency has been lifted.
