CORPORATE SECURITY

Security is a shared responsibility

RESOURCES

CRISIS MANAGEMENT TEAM (CMT)

- Manages the Country Office response to incidents which affect WBG staff, facilities, or resources
- Develops business continuity procedures and supports the recovery of time critical business processes

SECURITY OPERATIONS CENTER (SOC)

- The 24/7 emergency focal point for the World Bank Group
- Monitors and analyzes global threats and communicates the potential impact on WBG staff and operations

SECURITY SPECIALIST

- Provides security assistance and advice to staff in Country Offices
- Assists with crisis response and security incidents

HEALTH SERVICES DEPARTMENT (HSD)

- Manages the emergency medical program
- Oversees the medical emergency response procedures in Country Offices

TRAVEL ADVISORY

- Provides information on mission status and requirements
- Contains security and emergency medical contacts http://TravelAdvisory

PROCEDURES

If you observe an incident, inform the CMT, SOC, or your Security Specialist once you are safe.

SHELTER IN PLACE

- If the danger is greater outside than inside, shelter in place
- Follow instructions from CO Crisis Management Team or public address announcements

During Severe Weather

- Move to a windowless interior room
- Take cover under a solid object
- Wait until all clear

EVACUATIONS

Fire

- If you see the fire, alert others and evacuate
- When you hear the alarm, evacuate immediately
- Follow instructions from authorities
- Do not use elevators

Non-fire

- Leave the building immediately
- Comply with CO Crisis
 Management Team or public
 address announcements
- Leave the exit routes clear
- Comply with directives from first responders

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

In Washington DC WBG offices:

 Contact the Security
 Operations Center (SOC) at +1 202-458-8888 (or x88888 from a desk phone).

In overseas locations:

- Call local resources and the Medical Emergency Response Coordinator (MERC) listed on the Travel Advisory (http://traveladvisory)
- If you cannot immediately reach the MERC, call the SOC

ACTIVE SHOOTER

An active shooter is an individual engaged in attempting to kill people in a confined space or populated area. If faced with an active shooter situation you will have to quickly decide the best way to protect your own life.



RUN

- Leave your belongings
- Escape, if possible
- Once safe, call Emergency Services



HIDE

- Lock/barricade the door
- Turn out the lights
- Silence your phone
- Hide behind or under large objects
- Remain very quiet



FIGHT

- Fight as a last resort and when your life is in danger
- Use any items available
- Commit to your actions

PREPAREDNESS AT WORK AND AT HOME



HELP SECURITY HELP YOU

- Verify your personal information in myHR
- Report suspicious activity
- Take role/country-specific security training
- Obtain Country Clearance prior to travel



KNOW YOUR CMT

- Participate in all drills organized by the CMT
- Keep emergency numbers handy (http://traveladvisory)
- Follow all instructions issued by the CMT



MAKE A PLAN

- Know alternate exits
- Identify safe locations to shelter
- Discuss the plan with family



HAVE A KIT | STORE EMERGENCY SUPPLIES

Recommended supplies:

- Water
- Non-perishable food
- Medications
- Flashlight and batteries
- First aid kit

- Copies of important documents
- Phone chargers
- Personal hygiene items
- Cash

Security Responsiveness e-Learning

Women's Security Awareness Training (WSAT)

A one-day program designed for a female audience that covers the specific safety challenges they face and ways to manage those challenges.



One-day course designed to guide staff in Country Offices on how to prepare for and respond to location-specific emergencies.
